Or if you "pouvez parlez français assez bien" I may be able to be of assistance. It's been about a decade since I was at university studying French but I can usually obtain the general idea that is involved and re-present it in English.

I was astounded that one did not need at least 3 block moves to solve this puzzle but as I pushed a bit farther, I may have solved it once with 2 block moves.

One of Adri's user puzzles that I tried recently was one that I would have presumed couldn't be solvable at above Generated: 24 June, 2019, 23:36

120% until I saw Daniel's high score on it which was closer to 190%. It all had to do with moving, pivoting and dropping the block on top on the avatar's footprint so as to make the detective do the work of the avatar.

Very clever and kudos to Daniel! It's a bit like the concept of judo and other martial arts where you can utilize the force and movement of one's assailant against himself instead of making an outright assault.

Adam, just out of curiosity I tried to locate that Adri puzzle, but couldn't. Maybe it's not from Adri. Thanks for your compliment, but I think now those kinds of "tricks" are just a matter of experience. I have a lot of them in my current arsenal, little things accumulated over the course of time, from playing many puzzles. Even yesterday I added a new one, which I'll be posting separately. Some are even glitches or indeed blatant bugs of the game. I've caught many, not all of them can be used.

Also, I'm sorry for breaking some of your records :-p mainly in puzzles from Taka and Mirage (and also the pq2fans.com series from Jay-D). I like them a lot and seen great solutions from you. There was one which I would have never improved if it weren't for your score. I just sometimes stretch the time a little, by a second or so, not necessarily via Fast Turning, but I'm on a roll here. On my new Dani profile I played 9 TAKA puzzles and took the record on 8 of them, the exception was PQ-H which TAKA himself improved - I can't even match that one by like 2 seconds. From Mirage I have records on all 10 puzzles I've finished so far (I have 3 in grey meaning I played but never finished).

Thanks for your kind words. I really am making quite a re-entrance.

I was specially motivated for pg2fans.com d which was dedicated to me (about the "glass breaking parties" - GBP - theme) and I recall having been the record holder (maybe the others didn't mess with it too much, out of respect for me? eheheh... naaaah).

When I saw your name now on it, I filled with pride and gave it another shot and indeed increased the mark, I think by some distance.

And then, talking about glass breaking parties, I entered *****89 from Mirage which is a great GBP and was at 128% from silky and seemed pretty solid, but I was able to 158% on it, by doing a clever systematic drop from each possible (like 12 or so) starting/dropping position and short-circuited my way to the finish.

Just yesterday I went for pg2fans.com p - a 133% record from Bruce (it's always something BIG for me)... aaaand, I nailed it - 148%!

This was such a huge deed that I recorded it on my mobile (poor quality but it's stored) because I think nobody can increase this. I had so much fun in the process. First, matching bruce's record, then dreaming of the possibility of something different - involved a pretty risky FT and then sublimating for like 3 seconds better.
